Cost of Registration:

\$260/pers. Double Occupancy **OR** \$285/pers. Single Occupancy

(Includes Retreat Program, 2 nights lodging, dinner Friday, 3 meals Saturday, and 2 meals Sunday)

\$160/pers. for commuters Friday through Sunday (Includes retreat program, all meals but no lodging)

\$100/pers. for commuters for Saturday only (Includes Retreat Program and 3 meals)

Meet our presenter: Father Jack Clark Robinson, OFM

Father Jack Clark Robinson, OFM is the Director at Santa Barbara Mission Archive Library. He has taught at Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio as well as at the Franciscan Institute at St. Bonaventure University. At present, Father teaches as an adjunct professor at the Franciscan School of Theology. He is the author of *Franciscan Friars: Coast to Coast*, 2019.



Father Jack is a storyteller who loves nothing more than meeting, hearing, and sharing with others the stories that make us who we are as people, Catholics, and Franciscans. He has been doing that since about six weeks after he was ordained among Native Americans in Jemez Pueblo, New Mexico - and that was over 40 years ago. Those adventures of sharing the stories have led him to Singapore and Australia, as well as among his Capuchin, Conventual and OFM brothers, Poor Clare and TOR sisters and brothers and sisters of the OFS from the time that they were inquirers and novices to the time they celebrated Golden Jubilees. And he still feels that he is the one who is blessed the most by these encounters!
